Healing Hurting Hearts

4,155 students in 27 schools attended Healing Hurting Hearts presentations, in seven counties throughout our service area.

The Healing Hurting Hearts program works to break the cycle of violence, preventing future violence by educating school children today.



Noah Project received 1,661 total hotline calls.

Noah Project provided free legal services to 176 adult clients and their 229 children.

- 34 Protective Orders Sought
 - 31 Protective Orders Granted
- (2 orders withdrawn by clients, 1 order became moot due to declined prosecution of the underlying crime.)

The Prescription for the Next Step program provides emergency legal protection to victims in crisis.

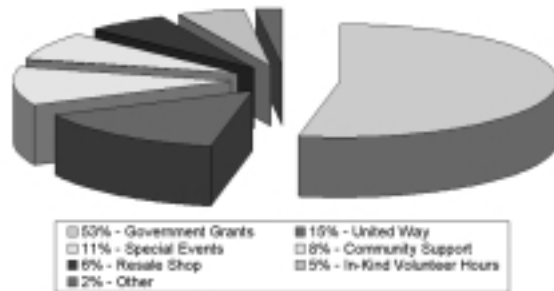

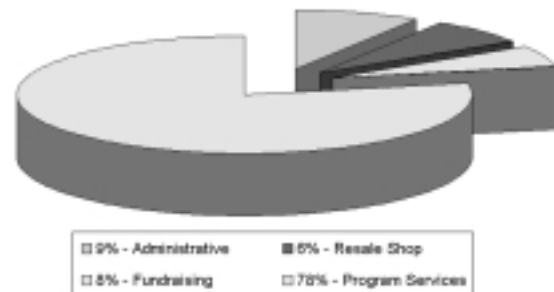


Financial Position
