## Financial Position

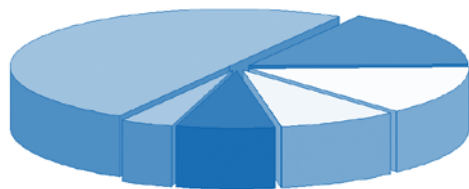
